## We are committed to the following:

- (i) Implementing standards of health, safety and welfare that comply with the provisions and requirements of the *Safety, Health and Welfare at Work Act 2005*, and all other relevant statutory provisions and codes of practice.
- (ii) Providing and maintaining a safe and healthy working environment, safe systems of work and protecting employees and others, in so far as they come into contact with foreseeable work hazards.
