Title: **Baby loopholes, sham marriages, and same-sex couples: neo-liberalism, sexuality, and immigration in the Irish Republic.**

This will be followed by a **workshop with postgraduate students** working on gender/sexuality related research topics. We would like to invite PhD students working in this field from other universities in Ireland to join us for this day of events.

Eithne Luibhéid received a PhD in Ethnic Studies from the University of California, Berkeley. Her research explores the interconnections between immigration control and sexual regulation in a globalising world. She is the author of *Entry Denied: Controlling Sexuality at the Border* (University of Minnesota Press, 2002); co-editor of *Queer Migration: Sexuality, U.S. Citizenship, and Border Crossings* (University of Minnesota Press, 2005); editor of a special issue of *GLQ* on "Queer/Migration" (2008); co-editor of a special issue of *Women's Studies International Forum* on "Representing Migrant Women in Ireland and the E.U." (2004); and author of various articles and book chapters. She is currently the Director of the Institute for LGBT Studies and Associate Professor of Women's Studies at the University of Arizona.
