Ensure your Student Record information is correct

- It is important to check that your name, personal details and contact information are correct on the Student Portal. You can follow the instructions available on Student Hub Online (Topdesk) if you wish to update your details.
- If you enrolled using the Irish version of your name, use this version on all documentation you complete within the University, e.g. grant forms, examination scripts, etc.

All UL communication should go through your UL student email address

- Your UL email account will be used to inform you of current information.
- Formal communications from the University are issued to you UL student email addresses.
- It is your responsibility to monitor your student email address regularly and, take such action as shall be necessary.

Student cards

All UL students are required to carry a current valid student card while on campus. The student card is normally issued following course enrolment.

Personal Advisor Support System (PASS)
